Havering Volunteer Centre News

In March, HVC held our AGM at the Havering Museum which was well attended. Thank you to Havering Museum for facilitating HVC's AGM and making us all very welcome. We heard from our newly elected Chair Kevin Trahearn on his volunteering experiences, professional background and why he joined HVC.

Kevin stepped up as Chair at the AGM as Lucie our previous Chair is on maternity leave. We are delighted to share that we have our first HVC baby as Lucie and her partner welcomed a beautiful Baby Boy in to the world in April. I am sure you will join us in wishing them all well.

At our AGM it was heavily shared that HVC would be facing some financial difficulties as we head into April 2025. Our Grant Funding from the London Borough of Havering came to an end on the 31st March and as it stands we still remain unfunded as of 30th April 2025.

HVC were asked to attend an Overview and Scrutiny Panel Meeting on the 16th April chaired by Cllr Laurance Garrard. The main purpose of the meeting was to discuss HVC's grant funding. HVC was asked to submit a supplementary report to LBH answering the following questions:

- Does the HVC represent value for money both for residents and the council?
- Does the organisation receive any other external funding?
- What would be the impact if Council Funding Ceased?
- Are there any alternative organisations that could provide these services?

There were 11 councillors in attendance plus officers who each asked HVC questions to then provide recommendations to the Cabinet Members which consist of a further 9 councillors. We are not sure when a decision will be made by the cabinet members but will keep everyone updated.

In the meantime, if anyone has any questions about HVC, our work or our funding please do not hesitate in contacting us. We are very open and transparent and are more than happy to share our position with the community.



Rainham Foodbank is so much more than just a foodbank! It works with frontline care professionals, including 26 GP surgeries, 41 schools, almost all statutory agencies in London Borough of Havering, other charities, churches and children's services. Also involved are businesses such as Tesco, Sainsbury's, Christians Against Poverty, Financial Conduct Authority, Barclays Bank, The Red Cross, and any other agencies that clients are signposted to, depending on their need.

Rainham Foodbank is part of the Trussell Trust's UK-wide network of over 1200 foodbanks. The Foodbank is a Christian charity, seeded by RCCG King of Kings Community Church, to demonstrate the practical love of God in the community. The Foodbank was borne out of a sincere passion to see practical needs met within the community. It is understood that everyone needs and deserves unconditional love, irrespective of social status, conditions, race, etc. Clients receive help in re-discovering their real and misplaced values, are able to re-engage in society and faith, and to manage isolation and loneliness.

Event Support Volunteer – Are you looking for a volunteering role that doesn't require a weekly commitment? You will also need to be reliable, patient with a naturally warm and friendly nature.



Volunteer Math Teacher – Inspirational volunteers required to tutor Maths to disadvantaged pupils and help them build a bright future for themselves! Are you ready to make a difference to a young person's life? Team Up is seeking dynamic volunteers to help transform the lives of disadvantaged pupils by building confidence, resilience and doubling their expected progress in maths. Sessions are between 60-90 minutes and will take place on a fixed day for the week. Each programme runs across an 8 -12 week period, usually during school term time.

Friends of Bedfords Walled Garden Win Kings Award!



Huge congratulations to Lois and her incredible team of volunteers at the Bedford Walled Gardens who recently won the Kings Award which is like an OBE for the Voluntary Sector! Lois Amos, a retired horticultural lecturer from Collier Row, was the driving force behind the rejuvenation of the historic walled garden at Bedfords Park, Havering-atte-Bower, in the 2000s and 2010s.

The Georgian walled garden was previously left derelict before FOBPWG started working behind the scenes to resurrect it in 2004, eventually securing a National Lottery grant in 2011. Since then the group has grown to 27 volunteers, who offered around 10,000 voluntary hours of work last year, Lois estimates.
